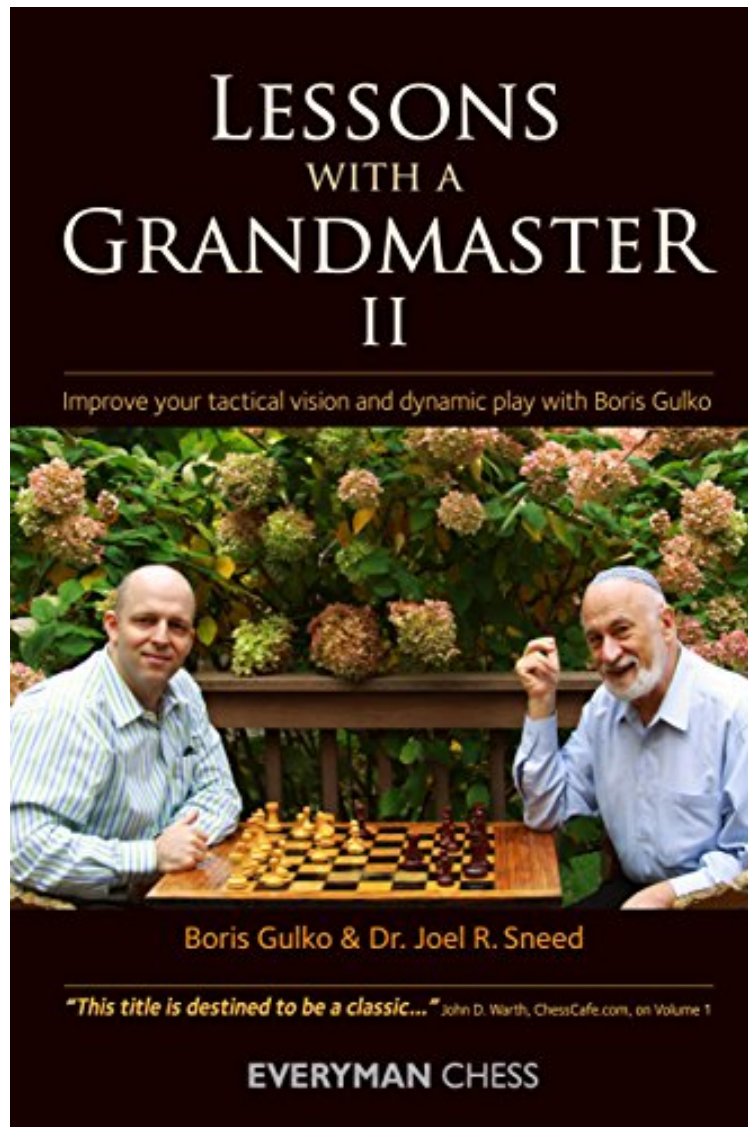

The first book in this series (I hope it will be a series!) dealt with strategic issues, and introduced some of the highest level thinking I have seen in a work on chess. This second book, which focuses on dynamic play, is of an equal level. In

both books, the subtle points raised by GM Gulko will make your brain work and improve your chess. I cannot recommend either book to the complete beginner or the social player who is just starting to try and improve his or her game. It is probably intended for players with a rating of 1500 and above, but anyone through 2200 will benefit. As the two men work through some of GM Gulko's marvelous games, I am reminded of Holmes and Watson. "GM Gulko, how do you find that move?" "Elementary, my dear Sneed..." Highly recommended for all serious chess players. I hope the success of these two books will inspire the authors to work on several more volumes -- perhaps ones focused on opening and endgame play, for example.
