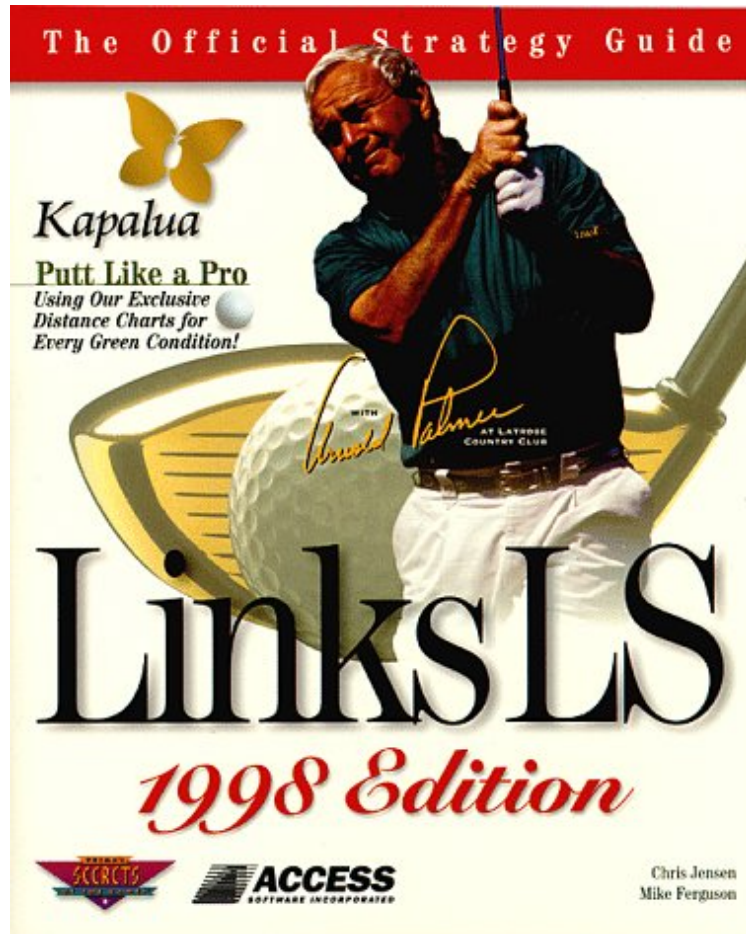

Its illustrations are very difficult to see, there is a lot more to putting and other subtleties to the game than the authors bothered to mention. The book is extremely overhyped. The authors indicate they are doing one a big favor by "revealing" the "secret" swing meters. This information is readily available on the web, along with tips on putting, loft, wind and other factors that are much more detailed and useful to the online golfer.
