Wiggin I have a weekly game group, and we tend to play games like Avalon, Cosmic Encounter, and Mysterium. This game is quite a bit more silly in nature, and while it may slightly irritate those that prefer rigid mechanics, we've found it to be an immensely enjoyable game, such that we've now played it three weeks in a row. A personal favorite was a card that asked for up to ten answers matching only one other person -- "Things people are scared of." Some of the best responses were sadly not worth any points (because they were so clever that no other person thought of them), but got good laughs (which, in my opinion, are worth more than the points, anyway). It's interesting because when you're trying to match no other players (or even just one other player), you have to decide between picking the obvious answer and hoping everyone else is going with the strategy of avoiding those, or picking obscure answers and hoping no one else (or only one person) picked the same obscure thing. It's great for getting to know people, or for testing yourself to see how well you know your group already. Things people are scared of -- common answers may include "spiders," "the dark," or "self-rocking chairs."
