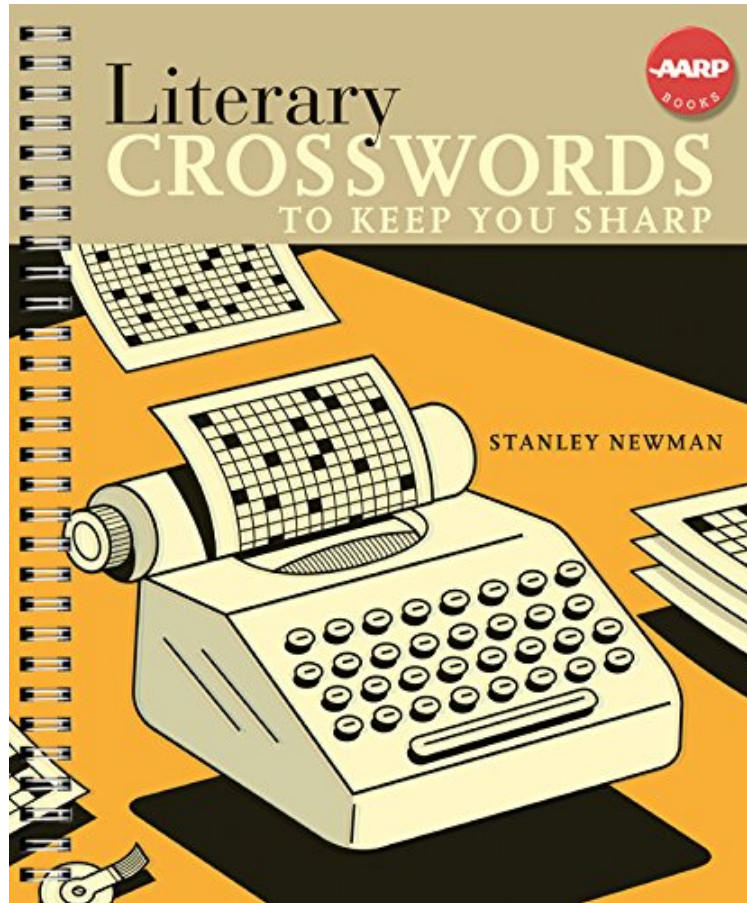

This book contains 50 professional crossword puzzles, with each puzzle dedicated to a different literary classic. Note that each puzzle has 3 or 4 theme answers related to that particular classic, with the rest of the puzzles answers being general knowledge words. The difficulty level is easy, with most of the questions fairly straight forward. I wont list all 50 classics covered, but some of them include Brave New World, The Catcher in the Rye, David Copperfield, Gone with the Wind, Little Women, Robinson Crusoe, The Three Musketeers, and Frankenstein. There's a good range of classics, and the theme answers range from the authors name, to characters names or occupations, to events and locations. I enjoyed refreshing my memory of stories that I hadnt read in 30 years or more, and now I'm inspired to go back and re-read some of my favorites. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
