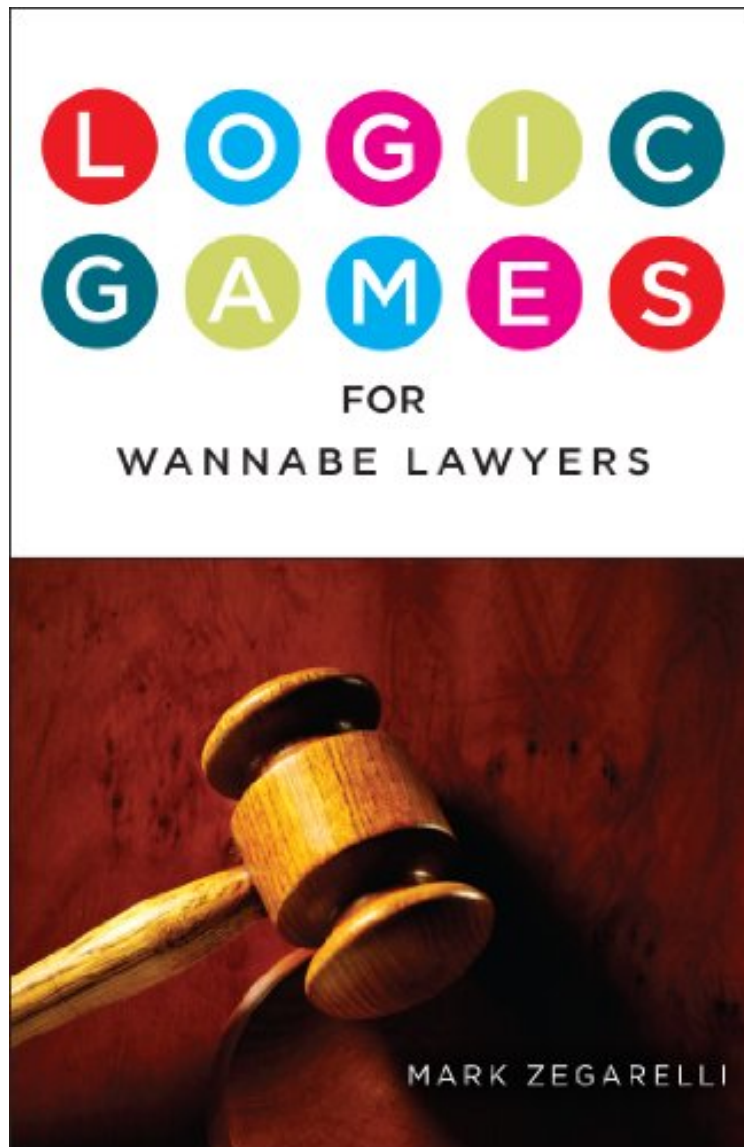

In each game there are multiple tracks to follow: in many cases the solution comes not from narrowing down to a single certainty, but rather to consider multiple branching

pathways and to chase down answers in the cul-de-sacs that match specific scenarios. In each game there are typically 5-6 scenarios. Here's an example from a puzzle involving items on three display shelves: one of the six scenarios: "If the football trophy and the stuffed animal are on the same shelf, each of the following could be true EXCEPT: (A) The decorative box is on the middle shelf; (B) The lava lamp is on the top shelf. . . (E) The vase is on the bottom shelf." Sound cool? I think so. My only complaint is that in the introduction, Zegarelli doesn't tell you if it's "fair" to write stuff down. I found about half the puzzles nearly impossible to do all in my head--unless I spent 5-10 min. on each question. But I've always been slow, and at age 70 slower than ever. Still it's fun no matter how long it takes.

What's the verdict? These challenging conundrums give wannabe attorneys the edge they need to succeed! Every game contains the type of problems encountered on admissions tests to law schools, with questions that help sharpen reasoning skills and powers of logic. So grab a study buddy, and start solving. We rest our case . . . so you can win yours!
