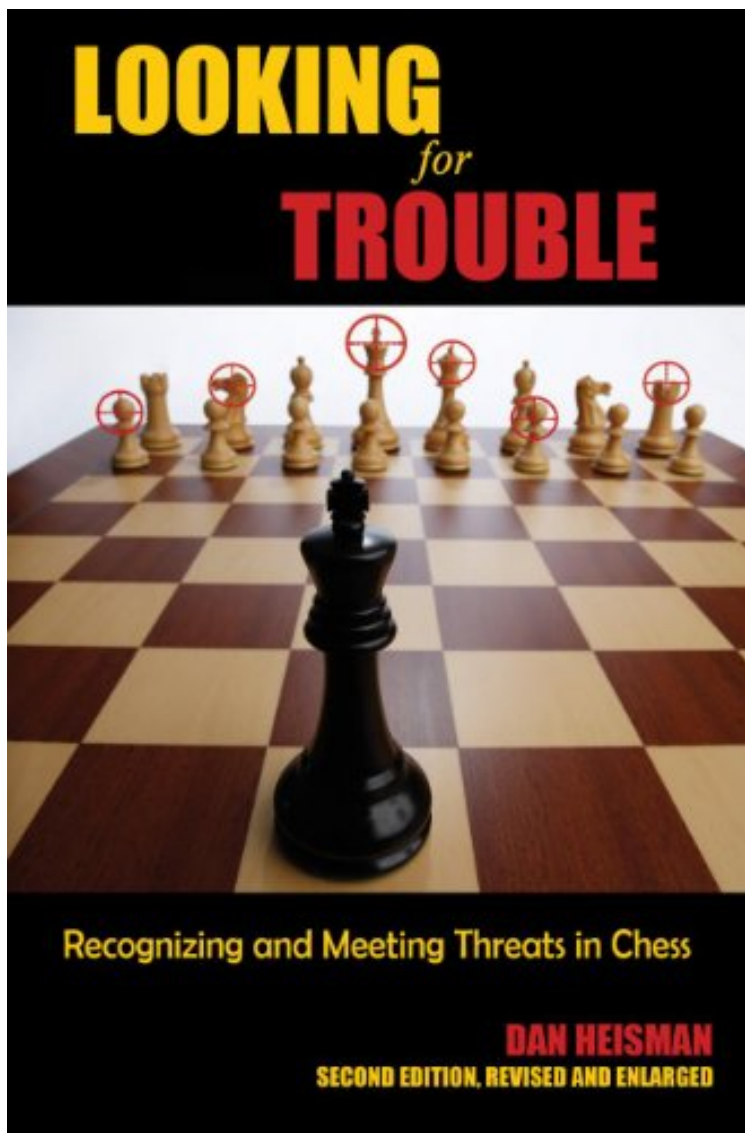

Almost all tactics books take the approach of providing a position where there is a forced win, checkmate, or draw.However Looking for Trouble now in a revised and enlarged second edition takes a different tack. It helps you to recognize threats by providing over 300 problems in which you focus on identifying and meeting threats in the opening, middlegame and endgame. The authors clear explanations are presented in a manner that should greatly benefit players of all levels.
