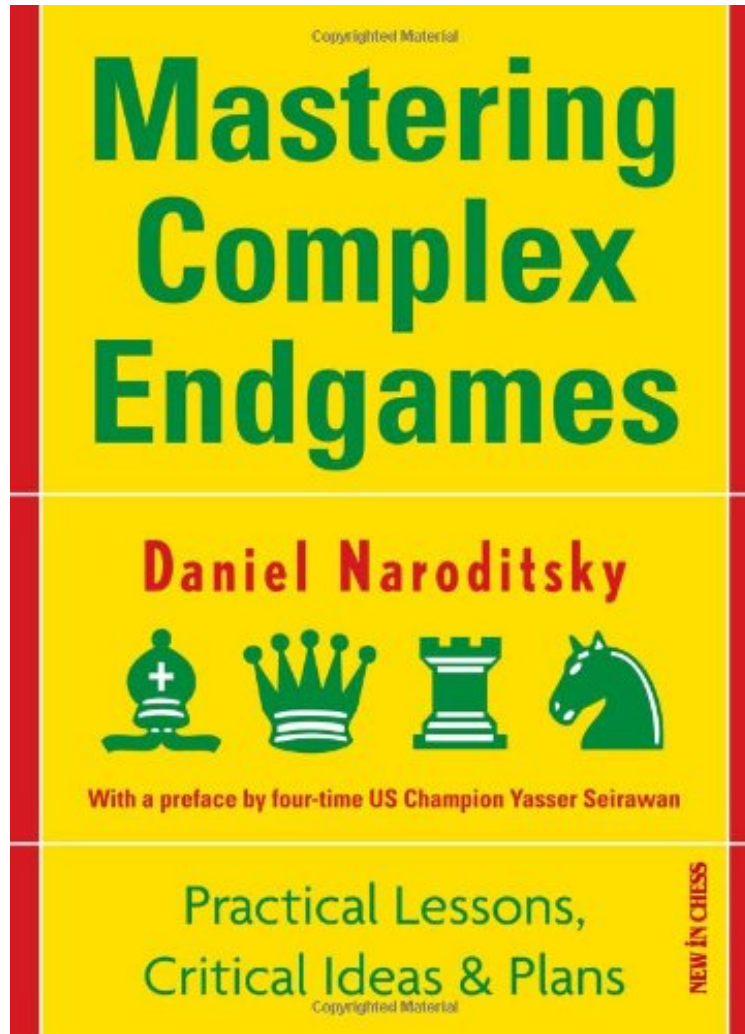

good reason. Even for a professional player it is very difficult to provide correct analysis of such endgames. It is even more surprising when it is done by a sixteen year old player (I believe Daniel was 16 years old when he began to write it). This book definitely fills a certain gap in this area. Now, I want to say why I gave this book only 4 stars. I really liked the way this book is organized and examples in the book are interesting. However, in certain positions I do not agree with the evaluation of the position (I am a correspondence player with rating about ~2400) and should warn a reader that analysis in some places is inaccurate. Nevertheless this book will be a valuable addition to a chess library of any player who wants to improve his understanding of the practical endgame. It will be even more useful if you will take time to analyse positions yourself (another useful lesson to learn about complex endgames is that even with the help of computer analysis it takes long time to find the true nature of the position). 2 of 4 people found the following review helpful.
