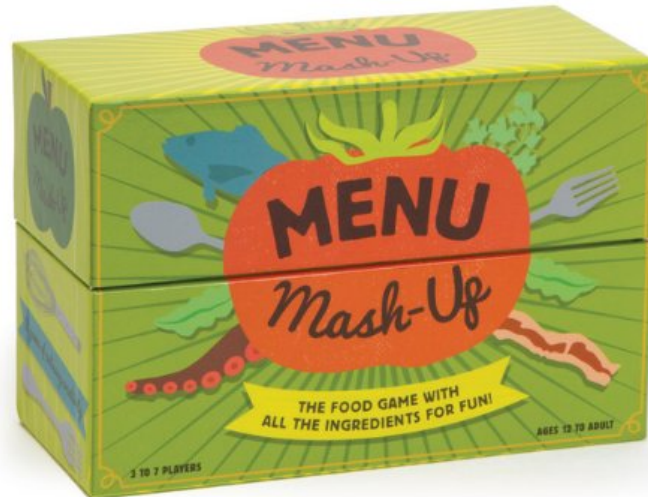

Every round, one person plays the judge and flips over a card describing what the other players (the chefs) are going to attempt to create. The players then put together a menu from the cards in their hand, and the judge ultimately decides which concoction they think is the best. Very simple, and often very funny ("Boiled anchovy ice cream with tartar sauce reduction"? Maybe if the category is "Disgust Me"!)

It only gets four stars from me because the production quality is so very low. The cards are extremely flimsy and don't even have rounded edges. It's a good thing the game is cheap because with heavy play you'll probably be replacing it soon enough.
