I am a huge fan of "Art of" books and I own about 10 or so different ones. The cover is very attractive how Aloy's silhouette is glossy and the surrounding background is matte. I tried to show this in the video.The book shows off artwork of all the characters/tribes from the games, the machines and the environments. The character designs are very detailed. I was slightly disappointed in the environmental work, which is what I was looking forward to most. Some of the designs were created at a smaller size and when they blew them up for the book they got a little chunky. Only a few images seemed chunky though. The

style used for the environments wasn't my favorite. It looked like they used a lot of reference images/textures layered in Photoshop rather than being 100% drawn. This makes total sense from a design standpoint to save time/money etc, but its not as pretty to look at. I'm not a digital artist, so I can't say for sure, this might be a common technique, but this has never stood out to me with a lot of other work i've seen. Its still beautiful and very imaginative, so I'm not nocking any stars for it. I paid \$24 for this book, and I don't regret it at all. I'm not sure if I'd pay the full \$40 though.
