I say "highlight reel" because the original Japanese edition of the Apollo Justice art book has far more art. However, it does show Apollo and his beta designs, Ema and some of her beta designs, and some for Klavier. Most, however, are just finished art from AJ:AA and promotional art.But it's a well made book and it costs less than buying the Trilogy art and the AJ art book separately. The Dual Destinies art book was better and hopefully the Spirit of Justice art book will

Great content -- just wish there was more of itBy Jordan KnappThis is a lovely art book for fans of the Ace Attorney franchise. It has a sturdy texture on the front and back cover, not easy to bend or tear, and came shrink-wrapped, meaning that it was in pristine condition. The content of the book may strike some as a bit light, as noted by other reviewers. The Art of Phoenix Wright: Ace Attorney is essentially a collection of high-definition character art and poses for every single one of the many characters in the first four Ace Attorney games. Though some minor characters who only appear in a single episode (such as Sal Manella or Regina Berry) have only a few poses shown, there is overall a nice variety in the art collection for all of the characters, and some of the main characters such as Maya Fey and Franziska Von Karma have pages and pages of illustrations. They are high-definition versions of the poses you see in game for the most part, though a few illustrations are the original advertising or promotional material (much of which hasn't been released outside of Japan). The games included in this collection are Phoenix Wright: Ace Attorney, Phoenix Wright: Ace Attorney - Justice For All, Phoenix Wright: Ace Attorney - Trials and Tribulations, and Apollo Justice: Ace Attorney (contrary to what anything on the outside of the book might make it sound like, the section on Apollo Justice is quite substantial and is actually the only section of the book to include notes from the character designers or anything beyond a brief 1-2 sentence biography of each character). Between the sections on Trials and Tribulations and Apollo Justice is a brief section devoted to "Rise from the Ashes," the fifth episode of Phoenix Wright: Ace Attorney that was added for the Nintendo DS remake of the game. The reason I give this four stars out of five is that, as I stated earlier, the content is a bit thin. I would have enjoyed the book more if it had been more than just the in-game art with no commentary (i.e., included interviews with the game developers and art directors, a complete collection of art for each character, or concept art). I can only really recommend this to diehard fans of the Ace Attorney franchise (which I imagine are the only people looking at this review anyway) or those who find the art style of the series intriguing and want to study the designs in detail.6 of 6 people found the following review helpful. The illustrations in this book are not only the in game poses and facial expressions, but also full body illustrations and the occasional character in a different outfit sort of thing (i.e. Maya wearing a school girl uniform, Mia in a chinese dress, etc). You will find the artwork of the case title screens as well as some fun not-in-game art. When compared to other video game related art books out there, this book has a lot more illustrations and variety. I have my fair share of art books and this one far surpasses those; Udon really nailed it with this book and their other artbooks such as Mega Man Complete Works and The Art of Street Fighter. The cover has a nice texture and the binding is sturdy. The pages themselves are a nice thick quality. Overall, the physical quality of the book is really outstanding. I believe the only thing that would have made this book better is to have all the extra artwork from the game, such as the group shot at the end of the first game, in-game crime scene illustrations, etc. A lot of the in-game screens did not seem to make it into this book, but again it is still outstanding overall. I highly recommend it!
