I preferred the first book (Chess: The Art of Logical Thinking) in the series for a couple of reasons: 1) The first book was probably a little more relevant to my level of chess play. And I liked that he commented on every move in the first book. In the current volume he skips the openings. 2) This book seemed to have more typos and the depth of annotation fluctuated from game to game. In the games that McDonald really dug into he gave a lot of great and educational commentary!! It felt like they were in a bit of a hurry to get this book out. This is a wonderful games collection and I am glad I read it. I found it entertaining and educational and will most likely go back and read it again in a few years time!
