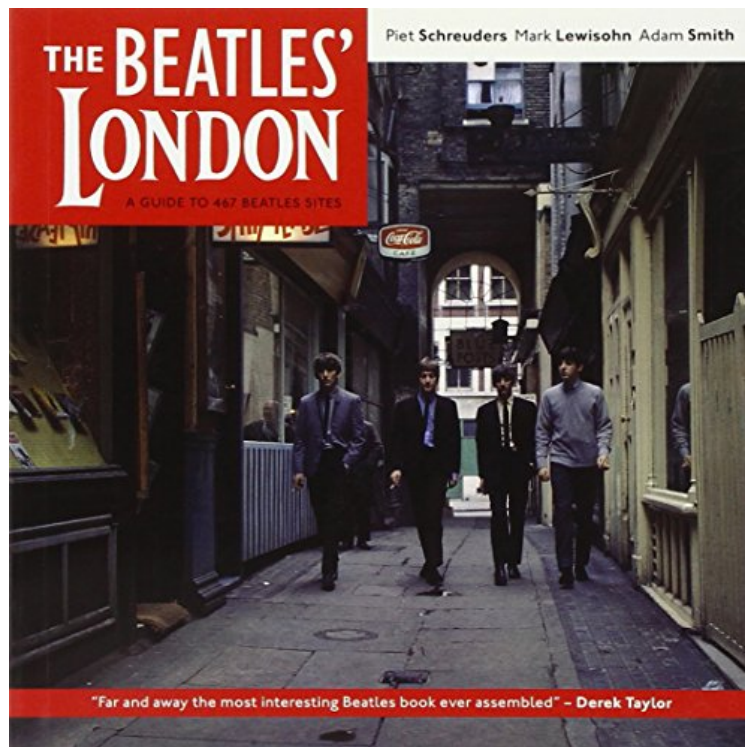

When it came in the mail, I sat down to take a quick look at it, but my interest was piqued and I ended up going through it from cover to cover. A short Foreword is written by Beatles Press Officer, Derek Taylor. In between the contents and indexes, it is very well laid out with maps, interesting stories and photos. For example the Abbey Road section is two and a half pages with pic of album cover back, 6 graphics of all the Beatles poses, and photo of the intersection today. With the general map and the area maps it should be quite easy to tour yourself around London's Beatles sites.
