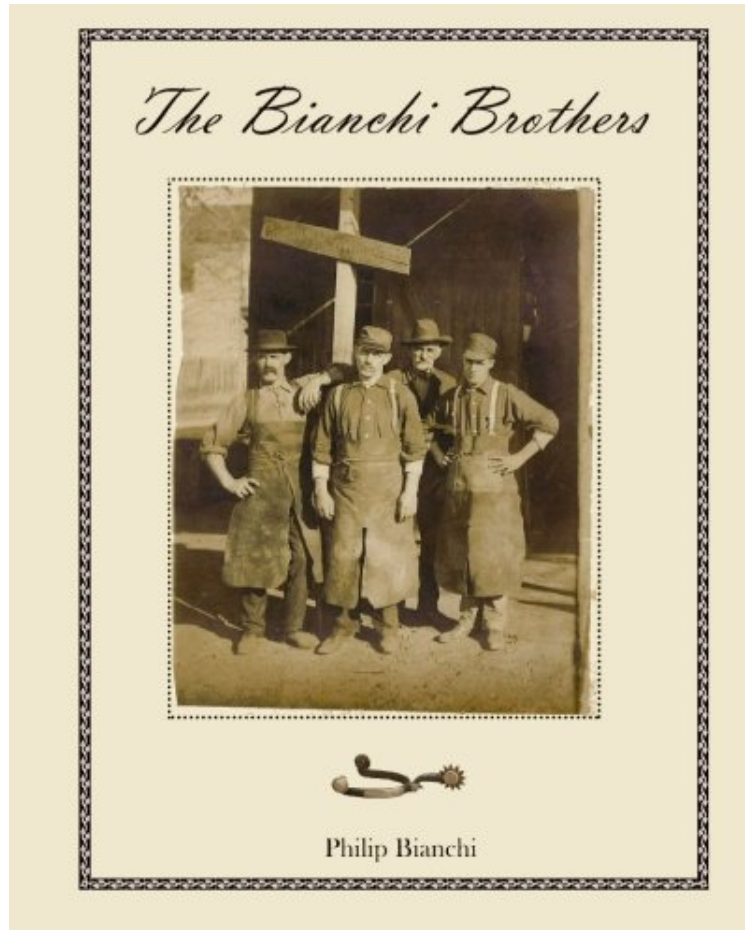

account of the city of Victoria, TX circa 1880 through early 1900's. Although the four Bianchi brothers and some descendants are presented, the main theme is Victoria from the construction of the railroads in the area, to some leading citizens and businesses, to the blacksmithing and spur and bit manufacturing businesses of that day. It is profusely illustrated with old photos and graphics which help to visualize the people and places mentioned. I would recommend this easy and quick read to anyone interested in the subjects presented.

This work follows the Bianchi Family's move to Victoria, Texas from 1881 -1885, with a focus on Paul and Joe Bianchi, makers of the very collectible Hand-Forged Bianchi Spurs Bits. It includes many photographs of the family and early advertisements of the Bianchi Brothers, as well as interesting history of early Victoria.
