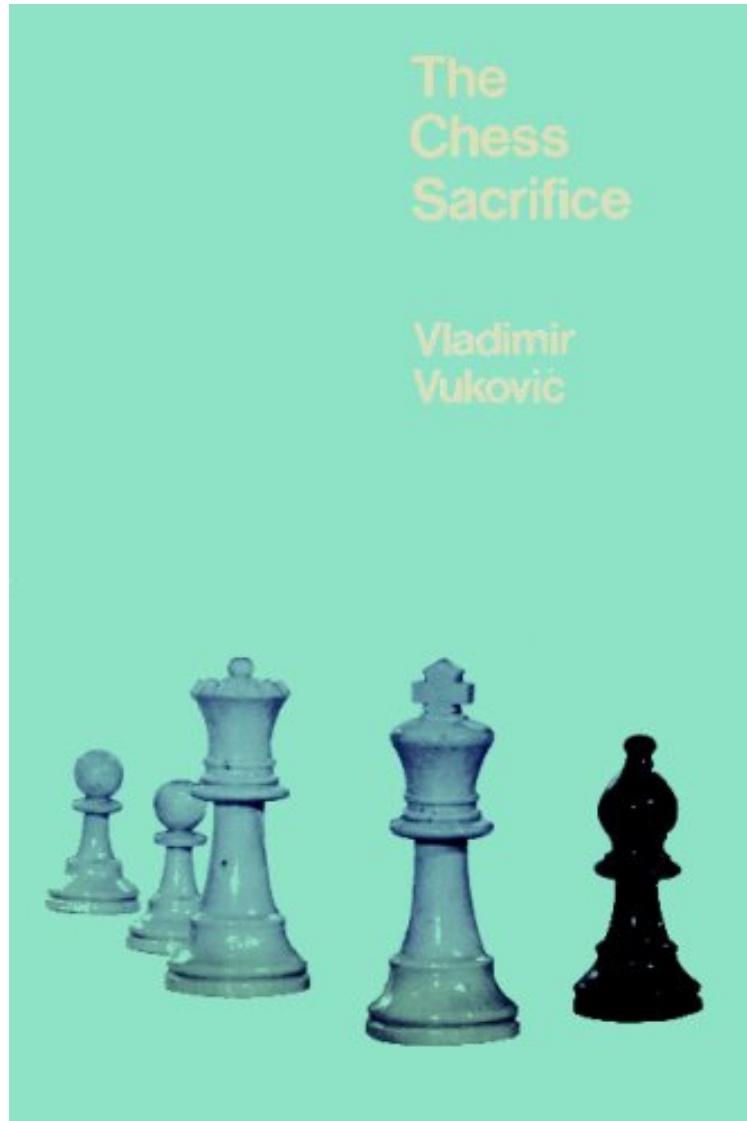

It opens up the dynamics of the pieces, beyond even trades. This is one of the great classics of chess literature. It was first published in German in 1963 as "Das Buch vom Opfer".

Language NotesText: English, German (translation)About the AuthorVladimir Vukovi (26 August 1898, Zagreb 18 November 1975, Zagreb) was a Croatian chess writer, theoretician, player, arbiter, and journalist. He was awarded the International Master (IM) title in 1951 and the International Arbiter (IA) title in 1952. He played for Yugoslavia on second board in the 1st Chess Olympiad at London 1927, posting a record of +7-6=2. Vukovi edited the monthly chess magazine ahovski Glasnik, the official periodical of the Yugoslavian chess federation. He is the author of Der Rochadeangriff, which was translated into English as The Art of Attack in Chess (1963), which is widely regarded as a classic of chess literature. Other books he wrote include Razvoj ahovskih ideja (Zagreb 1928). He served as the vice-president of the Croatian Chess Federation.
